The Chamber joined The City of Monroe and ULM in Washington D.C. for a week of Lobbying and Networking prior to the Washington Mardi Gras. Team Monroe shined brightly, highlighted by a "318" reception we hosted. Almost 100 people showed up to celebrate the great things happening in our area. Special Thanks to Mayor Ellis, Dr. Berry, Lisa Miller, Jamie Hanks, Kelsea McCrary and our city council. We closed out January with an amazing Membership Drive that saw over 200 volunteers join together to grow our Chamber by 363 new or upgraded members. Our legislative luncheon's remain strong. Our good friend Congresswoman Julia Letlow kicked off the year, followed by Senator Cassidy, Governor Edwards, Mayor Ellis, Mayor Mitchell, Shane Smiley, and our local delegation. Paul Hutcheson heads up our Governmental Advocacy Committee and they do a great job keeping us updated on taxing issues and policies that impact our area.

We have 11 committees focused on helping the Chamber fulfill its mission of "Creating an environment where our LOCAL BUSINESSES THRIVE! Besides GAC, Paul works with John Jones on Technology and Kirsten Gladen on Nonprofits. Dr. Wendi Tostenson (Fabulous) works with Maggie Generoso and Matt Dickerson on Education and Workforce. Christina Davis facilitated a LED Grant that saw numerous workshops for small businesses. Our Diversity Committee hosted 3 lunches where Darian Atkins did a marvelous job presenting on D. E. I. Our friends at Kinetix rocked a Social Savvy workshop as well. Our monthly Coffee & Conversations sponsored by Tim Green and our friends at CC's Coffee have been a blast. I personally think the highlight is our quarterly Jeopardy games. Mike Downhour and Terri Arthur re-energized our Ambassadors. Meg Keene passes the baton of Leadership to Josh Carroll. Our Young Professionals are growing and moving things forward. They sponsored our 20 Under 40 Awards which saw 88 people nominated. That is an amazing number and reflects the energy of this dynamic group of emerging leaders.

SMALL BUSINESS

Goal: The Chamber will identify small business needs and work with area providers on bringing additional support and benefit to those businesses.

The backbone of The Monroe Chamber of Commerce is small local business. The Chamber works hard to promote our small businesses and to find ways to help them grow. Each month we host a Coffee & Conversation at Tower Place. Local businesses get a chance to network, learn about our community and to have fun. Christina Davis led a series of small business workshops on a variety of topics throughout 2023 that were free to Chamber members. In September we helped Discover Monroe-West Monroe promote local restaurants during their

restaurant week. Also in September, our marketing partners Kinetix, conducted a highly successful social media workshop. We followed that up in October with our second annual Cyber Security and Technology Summit. The Chamber works with the City of Monroe to promote small business, support their quarterly meet ups and we use our newsletter and social media to celebrate our members. We also have representatives on the SEDD and DEDD boards.

Our biggest celebration of small business is our T.H. Scott Awards which celebrates new business or business expansions in our community.

MEMBERSHIP

Goal: The Chamber will maintain and grow our role as the advocate for all business and its members.

Our membership got a giant boost in January when our friends at Your Chamber Connection led a tremendously successful membership drive where The Chamber grew 363 new and upgraded members thanks to YCC and over 200 volunteers. We have dedicated a separate article to the membership drive. In January of 2023 we upgraded our membership package and moved from a employee based membership to a value based membership. Each week we are communicating with our membership through our newsletter and other communications. We hired Mike Downhour in April to upgrade our entire membership program. TECHNOLOGY ADVOCACY
